The Learning for all conference....why?

Stimulated by the 1996 Unesco Delors report *Learning: the treasure within,* lifelong learning has become an educational policy icon for developed countries. Lifelong learning, however, has too often been seen narrowly by governments and educators as about certificated education. There remains a general unawareness of the actual and potential contribution of public libraries towards learning for life by people of all ages and circumstances. This is despite many international reports, including in Australia *Libraries/Building/Communities* and in New Zealand *Public libraries of New Zealand: a strategic framework 2006 to 2016*, which have highlighted the support which public libraries provide for informal learning and formal education. Many people have also supported public libraries as learning places and spaces.

Learning for all, through the conference and its published proceedings, aims to be seminal in raising awareness of the learning reality and potential of public libraries with local and other governments, other educational providers, and with public libraries themselves.

Speaker from the UK, *Rónán O'Beirne* (author of *From lending to learning: the development and extension of public libraries* Chandos) and from the UK via New Zealand *Sue Roberts* (co-author of *Developing the new learning environment* Facet, and director designate of the State Library of Victoria), will bring to the conference a wealth of knowledge of learning issues, opportunities and technological and other responses for the 21st century.

They will be supported by 20 speakers from Australia and New Zealand about how public libraries are already contributing to learning for life for all, and their potential to do so much more. The speakers will respond to *your* questions in two panel sessions, one on each day of the conference. At the end of the conference identified outcomes and recommendations to governments, library funders etc will be considered.
